Auction Held Thursday night of the Fair

AMERICAN Judging - 1ST through 3rd place Ribbons awarded. All 1st place exhibits go to Auction. Then 2nd place exhibits are considered for Auction. No more than 50 Auctions items will be selected for Auction. All Auction items are chosen at judge's discretion.

Judging Guidelines as follows:

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| • General Appearance | 25 points |
| • Function/Practicality | 25 points |
| • Technical Quality | 25 points |
| • Workmanship/General Finish | 25 points |
| • To be judged Auction Ready, the project must receive a score of 80 points or higher from the judge. | |

LIMITS – 1 item per exhibitor in Industrial Auction

- DISTRIBUTION OF AUCTION PROCEEDS: **CHECKS:** Auction checks will be given to FFA Advisers.
- Checks will be written to the name as entered on the online form.
- Checks will be distributed on September 16, 2019.
- All groups and individuals selling exhibits through the auction shall be assessed 5% sale commission of the selling price. An Auctioneer fee of \$5 is applied to each sold item.

In no instance will auction proceeds be mailed to the entrant.

AUCTION BIDDERS—

- Groups and individuals are expected to market their projects and secure a minimum of **two** buyers.
- In addition, add-ons are also encouraged to further enhance the financial outcome of the project.
- **New buyers** should preregister prior to the day of the auction at the Fair office.
- Each potential buyer will receive two one-day entrance passes to attend the auction, provided the individual did not receive one for a livestock entry (limit one per person fair-wide).
- Individual exhibitors and all members of an exhibit group are eligible to purchase discount weekend carnival ride tickets.

Exhibitors:

- a. Belong to a Butte County 4-H Club.
- b. Be an FFA Chapter member who resides in Butte County.
- c. Be a student in a Butte County High School with no FFA or Skills USA program.
- d. Exhibitors may sell one Industrial Auction item and one market animal.

Requirements:

1. Exhibitors are **expected** to attend the Auction.
2. Items will be on display in Expo Hall during all hours of the Fair.
3. All items must remain on display, regardless of auction eligibility or sale.
4. The Butte County Fair is NOT responsible for items left on the Fairgrounds after 2:00 PM, Monday August 26, 2019.
5. The exhibitor is responsible for removing and coordinating delivery of the item to the winning bidder by August 31, 2019.
6. The exhibitor may establish a minimum bid.
7. Individuals and/or at least one group member must be present at the time of the Auction
8. FFA uniforms, Skills USA blazers or a professional appearance for independent exhibitors is required during the Auction.

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Required:

A display per project

(min. 27" x 30") and must include 6 pictures (min. 5" x 7") showing students working on the project during the process of construction plus the receipts or an expense list and /or Bill of Materials.

DIVISION – 996

4-H Group Auction Group - Entered by Club, all student names listed on each entry. This is for projects involving 2+ students.

DIVISION – 997

High School, Skills USA and/or FFA Group Auction Project - Entered by school/chapter, with all student names listed on each entry. This is for projects involving 2+ students.

DIVISION – 998

4-H Individual Auction Project - Entered by student name, organization listed on the entry. This is for projects involving 1 student.

DIVISION – 999

High School, Skills USA and/or FFA Individual Auction Project - Entered by student name, organization listed on the entry. This is for projects involving 1 student.
