

LARGE ANIMAL PEEWEE SHOWMANSHIP

BUCKET CALF, BUMMER LAMB & GOAT PROJECT SHOWMANSHIP

1. Pre-entry is not required. Exhibitors must be on hand when class is called.
2. Pygmy goats are not allowed in the goat class. Please see primary showmanship for pygmy goats.
3. The judging will begin at 4 p.m. See livestock office for final show schedule.
4. Animals cannot be brought to the Fair prior to 1p.m. on Friday, August 24. Animals will not be kept at the fairgrounds. They must be removed the same day that judging is held. No pens are available.
5. No cash awards will be given. Participation ribbons will be awarded to all participants
6. The Bucket Calf, Bummer Lamb and Goat Projects are for youth under 9 years old. Exhibitors shall not have passed their 10th birthday by January 1 of the current year.
7. There is no sale of bucket calves, bummer lambs or goats at the Junior Livestock Auction.
8. Even though this is not a competitive division, the judge will be looking at the overall grooming of the animal, (lamb may be unshorn or shorn) ability of the youth to lead and control animal, knowledge by youth of feeding and other animal facts, and the neat appearance of the youth.
9. These projects are designed to be a cooperative project involving the entire family. It is not intended to be a competitive-oriented market class animal project. This is not a 4-H sponsored event. For primary chicken, rabbit and pygmy goats please see primary page.
10. **No 4-H attire is allowed to be worn.**

PORKER SHOWMANSHIP

1. Pre-entry is not required. Exhibitors must be on hand when class is called.
2. The judging will be held on Friday, August 24th, in the Cassidy Arena. **See Livestock Office for final show schedule.**
3. No cash awards will be given. Participation ribbons will be awarded to all participants.
4. The Porker Showmanship class is for youth under 9 years old. Members shall not have passed their 10th birthday by January 1 of the current year.
5. Exhibitors shall show an animal already on the grounds and entered in a class at the Fair, with the owner's permission. No boars.
6. Even though this is not a competitive division, the judge will be looking at the overall grooming of the animal, ability of the youth to lead and control animal, knowledge by youth of feeding and other animal facts, and the neat appearance of the youth.
7. Porker Showmanship is intended to be a learning experience that involves the family of the youth, and is not intended to be a competitive program. The emphasis is on the experience and education. This is not a 4-H sponsored event.
8. **No 4-H attire is allowed to be worn.**
