FLORICULTURE/DEPT. B

RULES -

1. All state and local rules apply.
2. Entries must have been designed and grown by the exhibitor within the current Fair year (September 2018 to August 2019).
3. Floral Design arrangement plant material need not be grown by the designer.
4. Competition is open to amateur gardeners and designers living in Butte, Colusa, Glenn, Sutter or Yuba counties.
5. *AMATEURS are anyone who grows and Show for pleasure rather than as a profession.
6. ***PROFESSIONALS** are flower growers, floral arrangers and designers whose chief source of income is from these activities are considered professionals they can only compete in the professional florist divisions in floral design.
7. Flower show judges and instructors are considered **MASTERS** and may only compete in the Professionals/Master's Divisions in Floral Design.
8. Exhibitors are required to complete entries online by specified deadlines.
9. Submit entries at www.buttecountyfair.com. Computers and assistance are available at Fair office (530-846-3626) if needed
10. Containers for fresh cut flower and foliage specimens will be supplied by the Fair.
11. Containers owned by exhibitors must be marked with a durable label with his/her name and phone number. Exhibitor must furnish an acceptable saucer for watering.
12. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE MOVABLE BY ALL STAFF & VOLUNTEERS. Management will not be responsible for loss or breakage.
13. No artificial or treated fresh plant material is permitted in exhibits except as specified.
14. The Scale of Points shown in each section shall be used for judging. Unless a specific Scale of Points is shown for a division.
15. The public will be allowed to be present during the open judging process. *The public will quietly observe without comment.* Anyone disrupting the judging process will be asked to leave the building.
16. The following factors will be considered in judging each class wherever applicable: perfection of bloom, perfection of foliage, size, and length of stem, condition and color.
17. Receiving will be in the Flower Bowl building.
18. Exhibitors are responsible for maintaining their fresh cut flower and foliage exhibits in show-ready condition while on view.
19. Those unsuitable for display will be removed.
20. Freshening/maintenance may be done by prior arrangements with Supervisor.
21. NO SILK flowers allowed in any Department B entry

- The Fair is not responsible for cut specimens after judging.
- Wilted flowers will be discarded.

Conditioning fresh cut flowers and foliage as follows will assure maximum longevity:

- * Gather flowers after 7 pm or very early in the morning.
- * Cut flowers before they reach full bloom.
- * Split or crush cut ends of woody branches.
- * Re-cut stems underwater and stand entire stem up to the bloom in warm water overnight in a cool place, to rehydrate after picking.
- * Groom entry and remove only leaves that will be underwater when **placed in exhibit vase.**

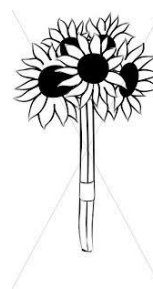

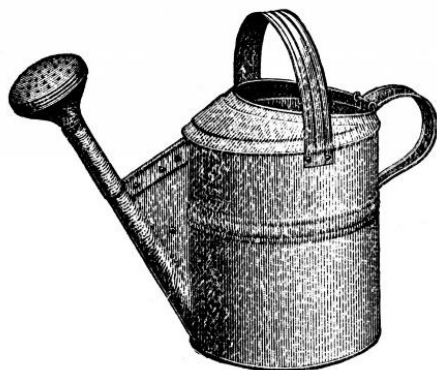
